Dressage Judge Activities Update - December 2022

Judges' Education Opportunities

Planning is underway for the 2023 Judges' Workshops and Seminars. The first Seminar for the year will be a Para Judges Seminar on 7th January at Cromwell Park.

G-level Zoom Call

Navigating the requirements to become a G-Level judge, and the record keeping to maintain accreditation can be daunting. To help answer any questions about how to become a judge or the requirements for accreditation we will be holding another Zoom session. Judges or anyone interested in become a judge are welcome to attend. Register your interest by emailing dressagejudge@equestriansa.com.au.

FEI Pathway

The FEI have granted the AUS National Dressage Judges Education Pathway to be equivalent to the FEI Level I Dressage Judge Education pathway as of 27/09/2022.

The equivalency means that the approved National Officials can be directly entered into the FEI Level 2 Transfer Course provided they fulfil the criteria as mentioned in the FEI Education System and completed all necessary requirements. https://inside.fei.org/fei/your-role/officials/dressage/education-system.

South Australian Judges' Subsidy Scheme

The ESA Dressage Judges' Committee (ESA-DJC) recognises that to maintain accreditation, upgrade qualifications or gain further experience, judges may need to travel interstate. As this can be costly, the ESA-DJC have allocated funds from the SA Dressage Judge Levy collected by Clubs, to support Judges travelling for further education.

The purpose of the Subsidy Scheme is to set out a framework for reimbursement for South Australian Judges travelling Interstate (and across the regions) to upgrade, remain accredited or further their judging experience. It will apply to any expenses incurred from 30th November 2019 to 30th June 2020 and during the financial year starting 1st July 2020. This will be continued for the financial year starting 1st July 2021.

The amounts noted in this document are intended as a guide only. Funding is subject to availability and will be reviewed as part of normal financial operations. For any financial year, a cap of \$3,000 will apply. The ESA-JSC will review all applications and approve those that meet the criteria and intention described below, and within the available budget.

For subsidies numbered 1-3, funding is limited to five (5) Judges per year. A Judge may only apply for one subsidy per financial year. Judges must check with the Committee to see whether funds are available before travelling.

Please note:

Judges maintaining accreditation or upgrading are encouraged to seek Judging appointments Interstate and then 'piggyback' attending a Seminar or undertaking shadow-judging or sit-ins. Organising Committees may pay for at least part of airfares and accommodation and this then stretches our budget further and allows for more Judges to benefit from the Scheme.

1. Upgrading to A or B Level

Judges upgrading to A or B Level may receive a subsidy of \$1000 (max per Judge per level) for travel expenses to complete shadow-judging, sit-ins and the Practical Exam. This amount will be paid on the successful completion of the qualification. A report must be submitted to the Chair, ESA-JSC together with receipts for expenses.

2. Online Training for A or B Level Judges

Judges at A or B Level may receive a subsidy of 50% up to a maximum of \$100 for online courses that further their judge education. To be eligible for this subsidy, the online course must include a component of video judging.

3. Upgrading to C or D Level

Judges upgrading to C or D Level may receive a subsidy of \$500 (max per Judge per level) for travel expenses to complete shadow-judging, sit-ins and the Practical Exam. This amount will be paid on the successful completion of the qualification. A report must be submitted to the Chair, ESA-JSC together with receipts for expenses.

4. Gaining further experience in judging Interstate

To encourage Judges to travel Interstate to see different horses and gain further experience in judging, a subsidy of \$200 (max per Judge per level) will be paid for these Judges to write for higher level Judges, shadow-judge or sit-in at an Interstate event. The event and activity must be appropriate to the applicant's current or upgrading level. A report must be submitted to the Chair, ESA-JSC together with receipts for expenses.

5. Regional Judges' support

The ESA-DJC understands that for Judges in regional areas, the cost to attend Seminars, workshops and shadow-judging can be prohibitive. Judges travelling in excess of 120 km (each way) from home to a venue to shadow-judge at a competition or attend a Seminar for the purpose of maintaining accreditation or upgrading, may receive a subsidy of \$.50 per kilometre up to a maximum of \$250. Shared driving is encouraged where practical. Potential Judges who are travelling to attend a G-level Seminar or a competition for the purpose of shadow-judging may apply for reimbursement when they are appointed as a G-level Judge, at the completion of all the requirements. Regional Judges may submit one application per year.

Jen Gilligan – Winner of the 2022 LINDY WRIGHT MEMORIAL AWARD

The LWMF Committee was very pleased to select Jen Gilligan from nominations as the winner of the 2022 Award. The Medal and prize were presented during the Saturday lunch break at the recent AHDC Spring Championships on 8 October 2022.

This award is named in honour of Lindy Wright, a rider remembered as a positive role model and an inspiration for Dressage. The purpose of this award is to acknowledge those who show the qualities of the "The quiet achiever who demonstrates excellence in Dressage".

Jen is a worthy recipient of the Award, due to her substantial work as a volunteer and also her Dressage career. She has trained and competed her own horses from Preliminary to Grand Prix. She is still an active rider and coach-mentor of other keen riders. She has been an active Dressage Judge for more than 30 years and she is also a Judge Mentor, having helped many of our new SA Judges along the judging path. Jen was also a member of the SA Dressage Committee for many years and her main role was to organise and run the annual Young Horse Finals for SA. Currently Jen is a State Selector for the Dressage Squads.

When Jen accepted the Award she had the following to say:

"It came as a big surprise to be selected for this Award. I wish to thank The Lindy Wright Memorial Foundation and Ned Wright, for this honour.

Lindy Wright was a very dear friend, who was indeed an inspiration to us all. I have wonderful memories of many an educational, training or social gathering at the Wrights' beautiful property in Echunga and on numerous occasions we travelled Interstate together as a part of a team to represent SA. We all miss Lindy enormously.

Having re-read the criteria for this Award I discovered that it was to be given to a "quiet" achiever, so I think the Selectors made a mistake. Anyone who has been coached by me, been on a Committee with me, or pencilled for me will know that I am not very quiet at all!! I believe that the 'real' quiet achievers are all the hands-on volunteers who work tirelessly for our Clubs so that Dressage can happen at a grass roots level on a regular basis.

I love Dressage! Whether it be training (I am so very grateful to my main coaches – Edgar Lichtwark, Chris Bartle and Thomas Muehlenbeck), competing, coaching or judging. It began back when I started training and competing in the Adelaide Parklands on Greenhill Road, right through to competing at numerous Regional, State and Australian Championships in Queensland, NSW, Victoria and SA with some wonderful equine partners. Now, more recently, I have been able to judge and spectate across the country as well. 

The story of the 2022 Dressage Championships could easily have been all about the horrendous weather, but that was definitely not the case!



Located on a stunning wetland area on the Mornington Peninsula, Boneo sits on the traditional land of the Boon Wurrung / Bunurong People. Boneo's 'Arilla' Restaurant means 'Dancing Ground' in the local language and is aptly named. We watched some of Australia's best Dressage horses rain dance their way through four days of fantastic competition.

After a two-year hiatus nobody wanted another delay and the decision was made on early Thursday morning to go ahead. Riders donned their wet weather gear, climbed aboard and away they went. It was quite the spectacle with Drizabones, long plastic macs, ponchos and even fringed cowboy chaps in the warmup arenas - anything to stay dryish and clean for as long as possible! The arenas rode perfectly, even if it was a bit sploshy on the first day. The footing was great from start to finish, demonstrating what an exceptional facility Boneo is.



Seventeen South Australian horse and rider combinations made the trip, comprised of seasoned professionals, semi-professionals, very experienced amateurs, newcomers, youth and junior riders. Some experienced huge learning curves, others came for the experience and many consolidated their place at this level, demonstrating exactly why they should be there.

SA should be incredibly proud: we are a small State but clearly demonstrated that has not been a barrier to developing quality horse and rider combinations. We came third in both Team competitions behind NSW and Victoria and SA riders were very competitive across the entire competition - congratulations everyone!

I want to acknowledge the great job done by SA Chef d'Equipe Veronica Hannam who began her role well



before the event started via a Messenger group and continued seamlessly into the actual competition with regular communication and updates to all riders. Veronica must have blown up her fitbit with the number of steps each day as she attempted to make it to all SA tests and the daily presentations. She photographed most tests and prize winners and added regular updates to the Dressage SA Facebook site.

The overall impression – we saw quality horses both imported and Australian bred and without doubt some of them are right here in South Australia!!



Para-Dressage Spring Championships Achieves Greatness




The 2022 South Australian Para-Dressage Championships held a successful event in Strathalbyn last month.



ANOTHER FABULOUS CARL HESTER MASTERCLASS – this time again in the Sunshine State (and it only rained once).

Once again Australian Dressage enthusiasts were treated to a Carl Hester Masterclass held at the Queensland State Equestrian Centre at Caboolture, on 5th November, 2022.



A large contingent of South Australians made the trip up north and it was great to see so many familiar faces at the event. What a worthwhile trip it was! The setting was at the purpose-

built Equestrian Centre about an hour out of Brisbane, heading towards the Sunshine Coast. It has multiple Dressage arenas including a covered warm up area and adjacent indoor arena which seats up to 3000 spectators. It is situated in an idyllic 30 hectares of land with facilities for a range of equestrian activities and includes extensive stabling and onsite camping areas.

Lots of trade stalls and food vans, with the obligatory well stocked bar facility, greeted the excited spectators with proceedings commencing at 4 pm. On one long side was the VIP seating option which was well patronized and the grandstand was about ¾ full. The event was titled 'Through the Levels' and as the name suggests, the Masterclass started with the very young horses (4 and 5 year olds) and moved though the age groups and training levels to Grand Prix.

We watched a wonderful group of horses and riders during the evening, all with their own strengths, talents and weaknesses. Of particular interest to South Australians was a lovely 5 year old which was ridden very capably by Ruby Allen who used to live in SA. Carl addressed each combination with such tact, empathy, knowledge and good humour and it was fascinating to watch

the improvement with each horse and rider in such a short space of time. Carl was certainly at his entertaining best and really engaged his audience from the word go, but his insistence on correct riding and correct training basics never wavered — no magic tricks and no harsh riding, just intelligent subtle communication with our equine partners. He emphasized that negative tension must be carefully managed and that the flashy movers have their own set of challenges. So many gems of information were given out by Carl and as he always emphasised that the wellbeing of the horse is our paramount responsibility.

We all felt so privileged to be 'entertained' by one of the world's greatest Dressage trainers and felt so motivated to use the information we had gained, back at home, in our own unique situations. Overall, it was a magnificent feast of training tips and guidelines, in a great venue with an enthusiastic and admiring audience.

I would thoroughly recommend following up on the FB link below, if you would like to read all of Carl's gems of information that we heard during the Class written very succinctly by an attendee at the event.





My name is Lauren French and I'm a Grade 3 Para Dressage rider. I was born with cerebral palsy from the waist down.


Horses have always been a huge part of my life. I began riding when I was 4 years old at Pony Club. I was lucky enough to compete at State level and am still a Pony Club member and coach today. My Para journey started through RDA and I had the

opportunity to compete at both State and National levels over many years.

In 2017 I competed at my first EA National competition in Victoria in Grade 4. My dancing partner for this step into the EA world was Eden Eyre Mitchell - or Mitch. I was lucky enough to be given Mitch from my Dad as a 6 year old and began to bring him up through the levels. Since 2017, we have competed in many competitions in Victoria and all throughout South Australia in EA Para Dressage, RDA and Pony Club. In 2019, I was reclassified into Grade 3 and in April this year, we competed in Victoria and finished as EA Grade 3 National Champion.

I have many achievements that I'm proud of for Mitch and I, including EA National Grade 4 Champion in 2017, EA National Grade 3 Champion in April 2022, SA State Champion Para combination in 2019, 2021 and recently being named as a part of the SA High Performance Dressage Squad.

While I have enjoyed and am immensely proud of these achievements, being a part of the SA Para family and the adventures and memories we have created will always be really special to me.

Riding and competing in Para takes a huge amount of support. I am very lucky to




have an amazing support team that has been by my side for Mitch and I encouraging, believing in us and for being a part of the crazy adventures. I'm so very grateful for my coaches - Mary Longden, Pat Mann and Ruth Schneeberger. Without their time, patience, dedication and belief in Mitch and I, we wouldn't have been able to achieve what we have.

Para SA are very grateful and appreciate the support that Dressage SA and the Dressage Clubs provide for us by including Para into their competition programs and most recently into the Dressage Squads.

NAOMI BETTS AND DEMI VAN GELDER (LUCI)

My name is Naomi and I am a classified Vision Impaired Para Dressage rider with the degenerative condition Retinitis Pigmentosa. RP is an untreatable disease that over time destroys the light receptor cells in the retina, severely constricting the normal 180-degree field of vision. I have less than 10 degrees of sight remaining in each eye, with functional central vision but no peripheral vision. Central vision is the 5 degrees that allows us to focus on objects and more importantly to read. I am legally blind because of the restriction of my field of vision rather than my central acuity. This means I cannot hold a driver's license and increasingly I cannot orient myself in, nor navigate unfamiliar environments. I routinely get lost in my own paddocks when the light conditions deteriorate. Retrospectively, my choice of Friesians may not have been the wisest breed option. Lipizzaners I could have found in the paddock. Or Andies, or Welshies.



In 2018 I applied for Para classification. It was a bittersweet time, because in doing so, I finally admitted that my disability was not only impacting my life but would continue to do so in more and more invasive ways. This acknowledgement was a big step. I relinquished the comforting illusion of control over my life and accepted that the independence I had taken for granted was gradually and irreversibly eroding. It turned out to be good for my soul.


I have loved and owned horses since childhood and except for my university years, have never lived away from them. The unique thing about equestrian sport to me is building a partnership with another sentient creature who has a free will, over which we have no control. I can invite, ask or request that my obliging yet independently minded mare Luci performs a particular action but it is her choice whether to do so. As a high school teacher for 30 years, I was accustomed to managing situations and being in control of a classroom. Dressage with Luci has taught me that I have control over only two things — my conscious thoughts and my actions. It has taken time to accept this and to tune fully into the feedback Luci gives me. I delight that Luci is willing to try all that I ask and offers to try even when my requests are badly executed, incomprehensible or totally unfeasible at that moment. Despite all this she gives me her all. The price of awe is actually very little when every moment spent with her nourishes my spirit

It was 2022 before Luci and I actually began competing in Para Dressage in the Grade 5 division. In truth, it took that long to let go of my determination to push on in defiance of my increasing limitations. I had to retire early from a 30-year career, teaching secondary Visual Art and English and suddenly had days to fill and a huge reservoir of unused energy to focus on something. I returned to my earliest love— horses - and when the Clare Valley Dressage Club came into being, I saw it as a sign and a perfect opportunity. I joined up and along I went in ignorant bliss with my Friesian skill at arms destrier and began competing Preparatory. Over the next 3 years, we moved through Prelim to Novice and began to learn the ropes of laterals and collection. Para Dressage



is a perfect fit for me because the workspace remains a constant 20 x 60 metre, flat arena with a judge at C and sometimes at E. I've learnt to navigate the space using techniques that are also excellent training strategies — counting strides. So, my circles and loops are rounder, my corners are more consistent and our tempo, alignment and straightness can be measured in the number of strides that inside hind takes between points A and B. This does add another layer of complexity to remembering my tests but my headspace is gradually reducing in clutter as I gain experience and the exponential learning curve starts to flatten out a little. For a while there my brain was like Cirque du Soleil!

Our South Australian Para-Dressage community is on the rise and for the first time we have a dedicated Para Dressage Squad of which I am immensely proud to be a member. We are a fiercely supportive mob, full of inspiring people with stories like mine, as well as those who bring their passion, knowledge and experience to support roles. Believe me, without their generosity, we wouldn't be entering at A with our equine partners and pursuing our dreams. Having someone be my eyes and understand my challenges is a great gift and it is solely due to that support that I am able to participate in this sport. There are so many inspiring people out there and I enjoy the opportunities to also be of some help to others. I love talking with vision impaired riders as our numbers are small so it is great that I can offer encouragement. As a mature aged rider, I hope to become a role model, in particular to show others that it is never too late to chase your dreams or aspirations, no matter how far away they may seem.

Training a baroque type Friesian to high performance Dressage is definitely challenging and Luci isn't a conventional dressage type in either conformation or biomechanics. The combination of a novice Dressage rider and an untrained horse requires a lot of support to progress. I came to the sport with very limited knowledge in training techniques and just as despair of ever progressing was settling in, I found a classical dressage online learning community in 2019. Travel for me is problematic and Ritter Dressage bought Classical training principles and practices into my home. It was like I was back studying at university as I took course after course in the traditional methods of the Old Masters. Not only did I gain access to a huge library of resource material, but also to a likeminded global community of Classical Dressage enthusiasts. Planning and implementing training for diagnostic and therapeutic purposes has become my drug of choice and I have immersed myself in it. I love it. It energises me. Studying and working with this community has given me the skills




and knowledge to create gymnastically effective training programs for Luci's happy and healthy development. More than that, I have found a new and fulfilling avenue to make meaningful contributions in a teaching and learning environment.



Permanent and progressive disabilities have a way of clarifying things and putting life into perspective. Things that used to be important lose their relevance and 'being' rather than 'doing' becomes a priority. Taking time to appreciate is now at the forefront of my daily schedule. Time is precious when your sight fades a little more each day. I have so much for which to be thankful. Every day. Don't get me wrong, there are difficult days but with a positive mindset, they are few. Marcus Aurelius said, "Dwell on the beauty of life. Watch the stars and see yourself running with them." I can't see the stars anymore but I take absolute pleasure in being able to spend time every day, lost in what I love most. I choose to thrive because of my disability, not despite it.
